A statement of expenditures incurred in connection with those lobbying instances should also be filed prior to April 1 of each year for the preceding year. Lobbying any Aviation Authority Staff who are members of any committee responsible for ranking Proposals, Letters of Interest, Statements of Qualifications or Bids and thereafter forwarding those recommendations to the Board and/or Board Members is prohibited from the time that a Request for Proposals, Request for Letters of Interests, Request for Qualifications or Request for Bids is released to the time that the Board makes an award. The lobbyist shall file a Notice of Lobbying (Form 4) detailing each instance of lobbying to the Aviation Authority within 7 calendar days of such lobbying. Lobbyists will also provide a notice to the Aviation Authority when meeting with the Mayor of the City of Orlando or the Mayor of Orange County at their offices. ITEM DESCRIPTION

Recommendation of the Chief Executive Officer to Nominate Candidate for the Position of Chief Operating Officer

BACKGROUND

The Chief Operating Officer (COO) is responsible for directing the overall operational activities of the Aviation Authority, establishing and implementing an appropriate system of operational and administrative controls, policies, and procedures to effectively accomplish the Aviation Authority's strategic and tactical objectives as well as key initiatives. The COO represents the Aviation Authority's interest and provides guidance and advice to the Chief Executive Officer, Aviation Authority leadership and internal departments on a wide variety of operational matters related to all aspects of the Aviation Authority.

ISSUES

To provide this critical leadership function to the Aviation Authority, I nominate Mr. Anthony (Tony) Davit as Chief Operating Officer.

Mr. Davit currently serves as the Vice President of Attraction Development with Universal Creative and has over 30 years of experience in a wide range of aviation, airline and construction/engineering fields. He has a bachelor's degree in Civil Engineering from Purdue University, a master's degree in Civil Engineering from the University of Illinois, and a master's degree in Strategic Studies from the United States Air Force Air University.

Mr. Davit is a United States Air Force veteran retiring with 26 years of service. During his military career, Mr. Davit achieved the rank of full Colonel, including service as Commander of a 900-person USAF Group, providing leadership for a 1,900-person Joint Base staff which supported 48,000 service members, 56,000 military dependents and an overall supported population of 300,000 at Joint Base Lewis-McChord. Mr. Davit also spent several years with United Airlines as a Director of Corporate Real Estate Planning and Development post military service. Mr. Davit is a licensed Professional Engineer in Texas and Indiana and holds a Project Management Professional (PMP) certification.

ALTERNATIVES

The Aviation Authority can reject the Chief Executive Officer's nomination.

FISCAL IMPACT

The headcount/position had been previously identified in the budgeting process (pre-fiscal year 2022-2023), and funding is available through the approved Operations and Maintenance Fund.

RECOMMENDED ACTION

It is respectfully requested that the Aviation Authority Board resolve to accept the Chief Executive Officer's nomination and confirm the appointment of Mr. Anthony (Tony) Davit as Chief Operating Officer, subject to successful completion of the Aviation Authority's pre-employment physical and background verification.
