

The scope of this project is to provide dredging, excavating, and grading services for the east-west leg of the J-Hook drainage feature and ponds, north of the Brightline railway and east of Jeff Fuqua Boulevard. The duration of the project is 120 calendar days for Substantial Completion and 30 calendar days for Final Completion with a contemplated Notice to Proceed (NTP) date of May 30, 2022. Liquidated damages are defined as \$0 per calendar day for late Substantial Completion and \$0 per calendar day for late Final Completion.

ITEM DESCRIPTION

Recommendation of the Construction Committee to Approve a Job Order Construction Services Addendum to the Continuing Horizontal Construction Services Agreement with Valencia Construction Group, Inc. for Project H-00348, Dig East-West Leg of J-Hook Pond, at the Orlando International Airport

BACKGROUND

In 2018, the firms providing Continuing Horizontal Construction Services were selected through a competitive award process. The continuing horizontal construction services will be for projects with a contract amount that does not exceed \$4 million, in accordance with Aviation Authority policies.

On February 21, 2018, the Aviation Authority Board approved continuing horizontal construction services agreements with the following firms:

- Carr & Collier, Inc.
- Cathcart Construction Company Florida, LLC
- Gibbs & Register, Inc.
- Middlesex Corporation (The)
- · Prime Construction Group, Inc.
- Valencia Construction Group, Inc. (MWBE)

The scope of work to be performed under these continuing horizontal construction contracts includes, but is not limited to, clearing, grubbing, grading, storm drainage, sanitary sewer, exterior electric, other utilities, paving, curb and gutter, and other work normally associated with horizontal construction.

ISSUES

To expedite completion of the construction efforts prior to fiscal year end, staff has coordinated with the Maintenance Department regarding the scope, schedule and budget of H-00348. Work will include, but is not limited to, dredging, excavating, and grading of the east-west leg of the J-Hook drainage feature and ponds, located north of the Brightline railway and east of Jeff Fuqua Boulevard at the Orlando International Airport. The construction is scheduled to start in May 2022 and complete in September 2022.

Staff solicited pricing from four of the continuing horizontal contractors that have experience performing similar work at Orlando International Airport as follows:

Based on the received pricing, staff determined that the best value to complete the scope of services within the required timeframe was provided by Valencia Construction Group, Inc. Valencia Construction Group, Inc. have extensive experience with excavation efforts and have badged personnel and vehicles in place to begin the work as soon as authorized. Valencia Construction Group, Inc. has confirmed it will be able to complete the project for the amount negotiated and within the Aviation Authority's schedule.

Valencia Construction Group, Inc. is a certified Minority and Women Business Enterprise (MWBE) firm. The Aviation Authority has reviewed the proposal from Valencia Construction Group, Inc., and determined that Valencia Construction Group, Inc. proposes to achieve 10% MWBE participation on this construction contract.

On May 3, 2022, the Construction Committee recommended approval of a Job Order Construction Services Addendum to the Continuing Horizontal Construction Services Agreement with Valencia Construction Group, Inc. for H-00348, Dig East-West Leg of J-Hook Pond, at the Orlando International Airport, as outlined in the memorandum.
